

WRC Meeting Minutes

Meeting Date: March 28, 2011

President: Meeting called to order by President, Ed Beane at 7:03. February minutes were approved with the following changes; trophies donated by Wanda are for softball or baseball, Dutterer is the correct spelling for Bruce's last name, and post season cheer 10 and under squad got 3rd out of 6 and the 11-14 squad got 6th out of 7.

New Business: WRC Summer Camps; Summer Playground-Lisa Piecewicz presented her camp. It is a two week camp for elementary school age with an old fashion camp atmosphere. Field Hockey-Brenda Strohmer presented her camp. It is a 5 week camp for high school students. Every high school in the county is involved and it is for incoming 9th graders through 12th grade. They are adding a middle school league this year.

Treasurer: 7,364.44 in savings, 17,224.84 in checking. Honeywell Charity through CARC donated \$2046.10 to softball. Check is mailed to Janet Davis.

Dept. of Rec: Loren takes care of paper trails for donations and tax. Certificates of insurance, especially programs that go beyond July, request must be turned in by April. Programs can get port-a-pots from where ever they wish. By federal law one toilet has to be ADA compliant. UPDATE: next self help project will be heard September 21 and applications will be due just before that.

Fac. Manager: Bud would like to get a truck load of millings for the back drive at Mayeski. If he gets them he would like to get Laney's roller so he can roll the drive and lot. He would also like to get the roller again to roll the whole park (Mayeski).

Program Reports:

Baseball: 360 players combo rec and travel. Butch received a call for use of fields on Sunday mornings for a 19 and over team. Butch told them he needs league affiliations and a roster with complete names to submit to WRC. Saturday is the Kix concert at the Ag Center. Butch demonstrated a need to have a port-a-pot at Winfield elementary. It will cost \$80 a month to have. A motion was made for WRC to fund the port-a-pot at Winfield Elementary for \$80 a month for 8 months. This was 2nd and all were in favor.

Basketball: Is finished and it was a great season. This was Jeans has 15th year in charge. High school; AAV @ South Carroll-HS, AAV @ Linton-girls, AAV @ Parris Ridge-boys.

Football/Cheer: 113 registered for Football, 86 returning and 27 new. 55 registered for cheer. Two more registrations on Saturday, April 2 & 16 from 9-12 in the SC cafeteria. Mid MD moved the American football division to the Centennial division. Now WYFCP holds a Centennial and a Federal division 1 & 2 team. Cheer coaches are filled and there are 3 openings for football coaches. One of WYFCP's players, 14 year old Cameron Lawver lost his battle with cancer.

Winter Cheer: Last competition will be on April 9th in VA Beach. Registration for next season will be in late August and hopefully they will be able to fill 2 squads.

President – Ed Beane: Comments on his concerns with the way football and cheer is being run. Word used was dysfunctional. Executive board changes bylaws and the general board over rules, not acceptable. Coaches with threatening behavior, not acceptable, coaches should not be acting this way and they will not act this way in programs under WRC. Executive board needs to get better control over their meetings, conduct at their meetings, and conduct within the organization.

Lacrosse: Season begins on Saturday. All teams have started practicing. They owe \$4 per registration and a \$300 flat fee for the program. Q: lower Linton, is the school going to mow the field? A: Ed will take as an action item and Dan will follow up with Ed. Q: What is the rule on the upper field at Mayeski? A: HS has the right to use this field.

Soccer: Have 4 teams for spring soccer. Registration for Fall Rec is coming up and will be online only. Tryout for fall travel will be in May and June. They will be raising their registration fees this year to cover inflation. Q: lower Linton, what is Lax plan to help fix. Roller would help.

Softball: Field Day was March 19 and about 40 parents showed up to help clean up the park and get ready for the spring season. 137 registered k-1st 3 teams with 8 players per team, 2nd-4th 4 teams with 12 players per team, and 5th-8th 4 teams with 14 players per team. The emergency signs have been installed at Mayeski. The message board is under construction and it will have 3" letters. They already have permits from the BOE and it will be completed by April 30.

Wrestling: Season is over and they are having their Award Banquet in the cafeteria @ South Carroll High school.

New Business: Funds will be available in July for the Tot-Lot at Mayeski. Ed is excepting wish list for what individuals would like.

Old Business: Mayeski expansion—engineer needs 1.1544 acres for reforestation and then he can submit to the County again and he can get started. The park has been staked.
