April 25, 2005

--Presentation by Simply Funds fundraiser, includes Gianni pizzas, cheesecake, etc. Incentives are offered. Programs run for about one month, they provide all forms, etc. Delivered pre-packed and sorted (need to request that particular brochure). Profits increase depending on how much sold, starting at @ \$5/pizza sold.

--Presentation by Sports Section, youth sports photography. Local company. Can mail photos or deliver to coaches to avoid mailing costs. Has other items available for fundraising, i.e., personalized blankets, etc. Prices are lower than other vendors, particularly for the Memory Mate (\$10 vs. \$14-16). All digital photography. Seems to offer more products than previous vendors.

--Cheering: Hosting CCFL competition this year, Nov. 6th at the CC Ag Center. Still looking for bleachers and mats. If anyone has any connections with any of the high schools please contact Cindy Chaconas. Also looking for sponsors.

--Football: New treasurer so income/expenses may be unrepresented but they are off season so no problem. Will adjust next month. More vandalism on fields, requesting grant money from Carroll Community Foundation for post and cable fence. Need something impervious to 4-wheelers and trucks. Cost of \$15275 using 6x6 posts, grant would most likely be @\$10000. Football needs to fill out application and submit. Need to make sure there is access for emergency vehicles and anyone who needs access for deliveries, etc. Anyone who can help with info needed on grant form can contact Dave Taylor. Jamboree on 8/13. Two football camps at SC this summer.

--Wrestling: Would prefer not to lend mats to cheerleaders since they are >\$8000 apiece and easily marred, difficulty in transporting.

--Soccer: Travel is currently in mid-season. Recently elected new board, gearing up for registrations May 7,14,21 at the high school.

--Basketball: Season finished. Jean will contact John Berger to see if he's planning on taking over next year.

--Softball: Opening day parade 4/30. Tournament teams have started up and are doing well, fields looking good. NSA of Md. looking for a place to host tournament in June but Baseball might be using the fields. Rick Parker will check into it.

--Baseball: CC Times never returned calls for registration dates. They have put in a drain field and filled in the ruts on the back road. Custodian showed up for picture day an hour late, causing some chaos. All was resolved. There has been some confusion with Lacrosse regarding practice space, but this has been resolved.

--Square Dance: Nice publicity in Westminster Advocate. Thanks to Patty and Bill for trying to get space, will be using Mt. Airy Senior Center. \$100 donation made to the council to replace donation lost in the mail last year. The council appreciates the support.

--Coordinator: Summer flier info due 4/30. Anyone having info to take to the Carroll Association of Rec Councils please email Dave Taylor, our rep, asap.

--Treasurer: Treasury is divided. Jean has taken over Basketball and will take Lacrosse when they are in the black. Daddy/Daughter is full, May 6th, at SC Swim Club. Lacrosse is in the red by @\$6000.

--VP: Feedback for forms, most programs have submitted. Programs would like the ability to add info. Some confusion how to count facility use. Will use this form for one more month and try to refine. Dave will add more rows so more info can be submitted.

--President: Self-help for paving parking lot was approved. Rec portion is >\$9000. Needs more discussion but Gary suggests that Rec council pays the bulk and programs that are using the lot pitch in too. We have until May 23 to get any capital projects into county's six year plan. Add'l lights are an option but it is uncertain how long Mayeski will be available due to school board concerns over middle school placement. Meeting on May 10 at Winfield Bible Church to determine use of Krimgold property on Woodbine Rd. (Buckhorn and Woodbine) Preliminary ideas for usage include at least 8 multi-purpose fields and 5-6 baseball/softball fields. \$1.5 funded for park in NW, \$700,000 Krimgold, funding for SC Senior Center and middle school-sized gym (Oakland Mills Rd.), \$800,000 Leister Park, Hampstead.

--County: Certificate of insurance--if you need one, get with Bill asap (out of area tournaments, etc.) so they can be returned in a timely manner. Need good representation at the May 10th meeting regarding the Krimgold property
